Logline:

Detective Good makes history by bringing out the good in everyone.

Synopsis:

This film was created as part of the 48-Hour Film Project, in which a short narrative film had to be written, filmed, and produced within 48 hours. The film had to include the following elements:

Character: Amy Belanger, Historian

Prop: Crayon

Line of Dialog: "That's Not What I Meant!"

Genre Randomly Drawn From a Hat: Detective/Cop

First-time filmmaker Kim Sheridan accepted this challenge, but took it one step further. She chose to do it all with a crew of only two: herself and her husband, Jameth. Kim wrote, produced, directed, filmed, co-edited, co-starred in, and even created the musical score for "Good versus Evil." Kim played all female roles, and Jameth played all male roles.

This was the very first film produced by EnLighthouse Entertainment. Kim Sheridan founded EnLighthouse Entertainment with the goal of spotlighting important and often obscure issues that affect us and our world but are often overlooked or altogether unknown. It is Kim's intention to inspire new ways of thinking, and to effect positive change, through humor and the power of film.

Kim believes that change begins with knowledge, and knowledge begins with education. It is her goal to help make the world a better place; and to teach compassion and respect for the Earth and all living beings. Integrity is the number one priority in all that she does. Kim feels that film is a very powerful tool of change, and this film is her first effort in that regard.

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Director's Statement:

"This was my very first film. I kept putting it off, thinking I needed to learn more before I could make a film of my own. But finally I realized I'd *never* make a film if I kept waiting until I was really ready. So I searched around for some sort of contest that would provide the key element that gets things done in this world: a DEADLINE. And I found one - the 48-Hour Film Project! I was very nervous, thinking there was no way I could possibly make a film on such a short deadline - but somehow, it all came together in the end. I knew that I would have to make the film incorporating some very specific elements, including a character, prop, and line of dialog; and I figured I could somehow work these in. But the part that had me really nervous was having to draw the genre out of a hat. It's sort of ironic, because I kept saying that I could probably do any kind of film other than 'Detective/Cop.' And guess what? That's the exact genre I drew! At first I figured I'd just give up - not even try - and wait for the next 48-Hour Film Project to come along. But then I figured maybe I was being pushed for a reason - to get me to go places in film I'd otherwise never go. So I put on my creative cap, thought really hard about it, and suddenly the idea of Detective Good came to me. My main goal in making this first film was to gain experience in every aspect of filmmaking, so that's why I chose to do it all myself, along with the help of my beloved husband, instead of hiring a crew. I was able to learn - often through trial and error - how to do each part of making a film, from writing the script to creating the musical score to filming and

putting it all together. It was an exhilarating 48 hours with very little sleep, but I'm so glad I finally did it! This little film was a lot of work and a lot of fun to make. It is my hope that it is also a lot of fun to watch!"
